Frequently Asked Questions

My hospital is already accredited by AABB. Does this mean my organization is automatically certified for the new Patient Blood Management Certification?

No, the Patient Blood Management Certification is a new program based on the *AABB Standards* for a Patient Blood Management Program, which outlines the requirements specific to patient blood management activities.

Q. Does my hospital have to be accredited by The Joint Commission?

Yes, hospitals and critical access hospitals that wish to become certified need to be currently accredited by The Joint Commission.

Q. How long is the certification valid?

Two years.

Q. How long will an onsite review last?

The length of the review will be one day. If your hospital is accredited by AABB for blood banking and/or transfusion services, a Joint Commission surveyor will conduct the review. If your hospital is not AABB accredited, the review will be conducted by both a Joint Commission surveyor and an AABB assessor.
